Dear Parish Family,

Last week, through the example of the Samaritan leper, Jesus taught us that gratitude is a sign of faith. This Sunday, the Gospel presents another important character of a widow who persistently asked for justice, relying in hoping against hope, a sign of faith in prayer. Specifically, her persistence highlights the prayer that asks, seeks, and implores: the "prayer of petition."

Our experience shows that prayer often brings comfort, especially when our requests are granted in the way we expect. However, prayer is not always met with immediate or apparent answers. Sometimes, prayer leads us into periods of darkness, uncertainty, and waiting.

Consider the prayer life of St. Therese of Avila during times of immense physical suffering. Her experience teaches us that suffering can break down self-will and pride, leading us to greater humility and detachment. Despite her struggles, she continued to pray, trusting that her pain served a purpose in her spiritual journey.

There are moments when it seems God does not respond, and we must wait a long time for His action to become clear. At such times, it can feel as if our prayers simply bounce off a blank wall. This experience can tempt us to stop approaching God altogether or to give up the habit of relying on Him. Some may even begin to doubt whether God exists at all. Yet, in these moments, Jesus guides us to respond with persistence rather than to react with despair. In today's Gospel, the Lord insists that

we should continue praying. He even recommends that we pray "always," echoing St. Paul's advice to pray unceasingly. Jesus points to the example of a widow who persistently seeks what she desires, illustrating the value of persistent prayer.

In all our needs, we are called to exercise our capacity to pray. For Jesus, prayer is a sign of deep trust in the power and goodness of God. Through prayer, we reveal our dependence on a Father who provides for us. Prayer enables us to find hope even in the midst of struggles because persistent prayer is a powerful sign of strong faith in the God who listens.

Clergy Retreat


Archdiocese of Hobart Clergy annual retreat will be on 10 to 14 November.





FIRST READING

Exodus 17:8-13

A reading from the book of Exodus

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

2 Timothy 3:14 - 4:2

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures - from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?
